## Plural Rule 1

$\lambda$ half $\rightarrow$ halves hoof $\rightarrow$ hooves
$\lambda$ wife $\rightarrow$ wives $\quad$ thief $\rightarrow \quad$ thieves

$\lambda$ echo $\rightarrow$ echoes hero $\rightarrow$ heroes
$\lambda$ volcano $\rightarrow$ volcanoes torpedo $\rightarrow$ torpedoes

Rules for Plural Nouns

| Add $s$ to form the plural for <br> most of your nouns: <br> Like this: | Add es to nouns that end in <br> dog $\rightarrow$ dogs |

| banana $\rightarrow$ bananas |  |

For nouns that end in $f$ or fe, remove the $f$ or fe and add ves:

For nouns that end with a consonant before an add es:

> Like this: wolf $\rightarrow$ wolves knife $\rightarrow$ knives


Like this:
mosquit $\rightarrow$ mosquitoes mong $\rightarrow$ mangoes

Some nouns change spelling when they become plural:
